Cardboard Tie

Whether Dad wears a tie to work or not, creating a cardboard tie is a fun gift for children to make and decorate so that they can see the fashion statement that they've made of Dad for the day (or for a little while).

Cut out a large tie shape from cardboard (you could even use card from a large cereal box).

Decorate with craft bits and pieces and stickers.

Poke two holes in the top of the tie and using a piece of string or ribbon that is long enough to go around the fathers head, tie each end to each hole. Wa-la.

Desk / Office Pop Stick SET

Have some fun with a bag of pop sticks. Use colored ones if you have them or you can use natural pop sticks and paint them.


Bookmark

Cut a strip of card just big enough for four pop sticks to be glued to it. Spread glue onto the card and stick on pop sticks. You can add a 10cm piece

of thin ribbon or decorative string by folding the ribbon/string in half and pushing the crease end into the top of the bookmark (between the pop sticks and card). Decorate the bookmark however you wish - you could use stickers, small pictures, paper shapes or other.

Pen Holder

Cut out an 8cm diameter paper circle (or use a patty pan) and using a 10cm cardboard cylinder tube, attach the circle over the base of the tube using sticky tape. Glue pop sticks around the tube.

Coaster

Lay two pop sticks on a flat surface. Put a line of glue on top of each pop stick and attach more pop sticks to the top in the opposite direction. Stick the pop sticks next to each other in a line along the initial two sticks.

Photo Frame

Use a photo or cardboard (you can stick a picture on later) approximately 10cm x 10cm. Glue two pop sticks to the top of the photo and two to the bottom. Then, stick two pop sticks to each side. You may like to add a piece of ribbon or string to the back of the frame so that it can be hung.





Playdough 12 WAYS

for Playgroup & Home

COLOURED DOUGH

Add a few drops of food colouring to playdough to make it pretty

MARBLED DOUGH

Add different batches of coloured playdough together to create a marbled effect.

GLITTER DOUGH

Add glitter to jazz up your playdough and make it sparkle.

REGULAR PLAYDOUGH

1 cup Plain flour
½ cup of Salt
2 tbsp Cream of Tartar
1 cup boiling water

Mix dry ingredients together, add boiling water and mix. Pour onto a flat surface and knead. Add flour if the mixture is too sticky.

HERB DOUGH

Add fresh herbs such as rosemary and mint to playdough for an extra sensory experience.

Playgrouper's love using Playdough at Playgroup!

Don't be afraid to have playdough out for each session throughout the year - young children rarely become bored with Playdough.

There are so many ways to make Playdough more interesting and depending on the activity it can be saved and used over many sessions.

Playdough is a great resource and will help to develop the fine motor skills in your little ones hands. Your child's future teacher will love you for incorporating Playdough into your play and playgroup sessions - because it means their little muscles are building and they'll be ready for writing, colouring and drawing and will be more likely to master a great pencil grip with less effort. We've collated a few ideas to mix things up a little and make playdough more interesting for your playgroup.

SCENTED DOUGH

Add a few drops of flavoured essence or essential oils to create lovely smelling dough. Our pick is rose water or peppermint essence.

JELLY DOUGH

Pour a packet of jelly into the boiling water and dissolve before adding to the dry ingredients to create amazing smelling Playdough. Our pick is Passion-fruit jelly.

GLUTEN FREE DOUGH

If you have children with gluten sensitivities, you can easily replace plain flour with gluten free flour.

SAND DOUGH

2 cups of fine sand 1 cup of corn flour ½ cup of water

Pour all ingredients together and mix using your hands.
Place in a tray so your

feel the cool texture.

SKIN THERAPY DOUGH

1 cup plain flour
1 cup of water
2 cups oats
2 tbsp coconut oil
1 tbsp vanilla essence
1 tbsp cocoa powder

Mix flour, oats and vanilla. Add water and stir until the mixture forms a ball. Knead in coconut oil then knead in cocoa powder. If too sticky, add more flour and continue to knead until desired texture.

MUD DOUGH

4 cups flour · 1 cup cocoa · 5 cups water 2 1/2 cups salt · 3 Tablespoons cream of tartar 10 tablespoons oil (vegetable or canola)

Mix dry ingredients and then add oil.
Stir ingredients together in a saucepan and cook over low-med heat. Stir and keep stirring as the texture will start to thicken. Keep stirring until the texture is no longer sticky, then pour the mixture on a clean surface. Once the mixture is warm but not hot, knead until you reach desired texture. This playdough is great for putting dinosaurs or bus figurines into. Or, put some toy cars out with the mixture to make car tracks in the dough.

SPICED DOUGH

Add powdered ginger, turmeric, cinnamon or nutmed to your Playdough to create a lovely smelling dough.

Try putting this playdough out with a muffin tin for pretend cake play.



What does

Child Friendly mean to you?

Three councils in South Australia are working in partnership with the Department for Education and Child Development (DECD) to pilot the Child Friendly SA initiative. Campbelltown, Onkaparinga and Gawler Councils are all working towards Bronze level recognition by UNICEF Australia to become a Child Friendly City...



What is a Child Friendly City?

A Child Friendly City is a people-friendly city. The most liveable cities are those that work for residents of all ages. A Child Friendly City is one where children and young people (0–18 years) are valued as citizens, their rights are recognised and their wellbeing is supported. Child Friendly Cities promote children's active involvement in issues which affect them.

What is Child Friendly SA?

Child Friendly SA was established to support the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) focusing on UNICEF's Child Friendly Cities International model. Child Friendly SA (CFSA) is a partnership led by the Department for Education and Child Development (DECD) focusing on bringing children and communities closer by working together at a local level to support better outcomes for children and young people.

Six community goals have been developed by Child Friendly SA which aim to improve opportunities, experiences and outcomes for children and young people.

These goal areas are derived from the UNCRC and include:

Active Participation

Communities listen to, engage with, and respond to children

Safety

Children live in safe and secure communities

3 Health

Children's health and wellbeing is supported by integrated services

4 Education

Educational access, opportunity and achievement are supported for children, their families and community

6 Belonging

Children develop a sense of belonging to a home, family, friends and community

6 Play and Leisure

Children access appropriate play, leisure, rest and independent mobility opportunities

All three Councils are currently working in partnership with their respective communities to develop a Community Action Plan which encompasses these goal areas. The Book Week theme will be "Books light up our world"


The CBCA presents annual awards to books of literary merit, for outstanding contribution to Australian children's literature.










Thelma the Unicorn by Aaron Blabey

Another laugh-out-loud book from the best-selling creator of Pig the Pug. These books are fast becoming favourites!



Are you thinking about starting a Playgroup? Are you a new Playgroup Coordinator? Are you interested in assisting with the running of your Playgroup?

The Coordinators Workshop will provide you with all the information that you need to assist in these roles!

This workshop includes invaluable tips on how to effectively run a Playgroup, as well as creative play ideas and useful information on the value and benefits of play. This is also a great opportunity to connect and brainstorm with other Playgroup Coordinators and Playgroup SA staff in developing your own Playgroup support network.

This workshop is centred around age appropriate play ideas and activities for pre-school age children.

A change in the process of school intake has prompted a demand for stimulating ideas and activities for 4-5 year old Playgroupers, prior to school entry.

Pre-schoolers need and respond well to structure. They are more capable of managing intense emotions and they require routine to avoid feeling overwhelmed. Pre-school age children start to display more curious and questioning behaviours... they are more prone to pushing the boundaries and they often love to experiment with exploration and risk taking.

Child Safe Environments (Mandatory Reporting Training)

Explore the issues of child protection, gain an understanding of child abuse and neglect, learn about your responsibility to report concerns about children at risk and receive your certificate in Child-Safe Environments (CSE).

In order to be a qualified mandated notifier within the education system in SA, teacher registration requires all persons complete Child-Safe Environments in addition to the school specific RAN-EC online training (implemented October 2013)
